

Introduction

The field-based network of the Paris Pact Research and Liaison Officers is made up of national staff based in UNODC offices in Paris Pact "priority countries" in West and Central Asia as well as South Eastern Europe. Funding permitting, an expansion of the network along key trajectories of the southern route is envisaged to increase the coverage of UNODC's research capacity.

All Paris Pact data collection and research related activities are carried out under the oversight of the Research and Trend Analysis Branch, Division for Policy Analysis and Public Affairs (DPA). The close cooperation between Research and Liaison Officers and the Drug Research Section in the Research and Trend Analysis Branch guarantees consistency in the data collection process which ultimately contributes to the UNODC World Drug Report.





POPPY CULTIVATION, ERADICATION AND PRODUCTION







Seizures of heroin, opium and illicit morphine in Afghanistan, 2002-2014 (tons)







DRUG INDUSTRY AND TRAFFICKING NETWORKS (2011-2012)

Afghanistan dominates the global opiate production. The opiate industry involves various processes: obtaining precursors, extracting opium, processing it into heroin/morphine and trafficking onward – activities that require an equally extensive network of traffickers. A recent UNODC/MCN joint research found that such networks existed in each province visited. The number of trafficking networks and the links they have with other networks varies between provinces. The two maps examine the major and minor trafficking networks in each province.



HAWALA SYSTEM

Hawala is an ancient money-transfer system that traces its origins to South Asia. Relying heavily on trust and connections such as family relationships, the hawala system has come to be used all over Afghanistan. As is the case with any other remittance system, hawala can be - and is - used to launder money and support anti-Government activities.

Joint MCN/UNODC researchers interviewed several key informants (mainly hawaladars) across 18 provinces of Afghanistan. While most Afghans are new to the modern banking system, it is perhaps unsurprising to note that hawala has a significant presence in the country (Refer to the Maps). The informal nature of hawala, a lack of strict law enforcement to prevent misuse of the system and the close-knit nature of Afghan society mean that the Taliban and other AGE can use hawala to bypass legal regulations.






Heroin seizures in Armenia, 2011 -2015





Situation on New Psychoactive Substances (NPS) in Georgia

To reduce the increasing supply of new psychoactive substances, the Government of Georgia developed a regulatory and institutional framework for tackling illegal trafficking and consumption. Legislative amendments to existing drug related laws as well as a new law on "New Psychoactive Substances" came into force on 1 May 2014. Amendments take into account European experience regarding the criminalization of major groups of chemical substances utilized for production of NPS. The State Commission on Supporting Suppression of Distributing New Psychoactive Substances was established (with the participation of the Ministry of Internal Affairs (MIA), Ministry of Labor, Health and Social Affairs and Ministry of Finance) to monitor the challenges related to NPS, trend analysis and development of suitable proposals to the Government.

The statements by the Commission indicate that after adoption of the law, trafficking of NPS decreased by 90% in June 2014-April 2015 compared to the period June 2013-April 2014. From 1 May 2014 until 1 May 2015, law enforcement agencies recorded 229 criminal cases of illicit traffic in NPS, arrested 241 persons and seized 7.9 kg of NPS. MIA Forensic-Criminalistics Main Division identified over 260 objects of NPS from May 2014 until May 2015 (majority of them belongs to Cannabinomimetic compounds).

Before 1 May 2014, there were dozens of cases of ordering NPS over the internet and importing them across the borders of Georgia per month, while in the period of May 2014-May 2015 only five cases have been identified. Law enforcement agencies recorded 53 cases related to NPS at Georgian borders during the similar period of 2013-2014, while only 5 cases have been identified in the same period of 2014-2015 that indicate 90% decrease in trafficking of NPS.

The effectiveness of the law is evidenced by the outcomes in drug supply and demand reduction that have been actually achieved. According to official statistics, since May 2014 gradually less and less persons were referred to treatment centers and consumption of new NPS was reduced by 90% by the end of 2014 as a consequence of the campaign "No to bio drugs" and the law on new NPS.








Map of opium seizures in the Islamic Republic of Iran, 2013

Maritime operations in 2013

As a result of a real-time intelligence led regional exchange and cooperation between the I.R. of Iran and United Arab Emirates (UAE) from 20-23 August 2013, approximately 7,284 kg of drugs (heroin, opium, and hashish) were seized in the waters of the I. R. of Iran and the United Arab Emirates.

The covert intelligence plan for this maritime drug control operation started 5 months earlier through exchanges of details and telephone numbers of a group of drug traffickers among Pakistan, Iran and UAE police. The destination of seized drugs, as stated by the Iranian police (with reference to what arrested traffickers have admitted to UAE police) were regional Arab markets (mostly hashish), and African onwards European destinations (heroin). The opium seized in this operation was destined to enter Iranian and UAE territories from the coastal areas of the Persian Gulf. During this operation, 10 members of an international drug trafficking network were arrested by Iranian coast guards in Iranian waters.

An intelligence-led exchange operation took place as the result of close cooperation among Iran, Oman and UAE. The operation started in mid-September, followed by ten days of extensive surveillance of a vessel run by drug traffickers. The operation led to the arrest of a number of traffickers and seizure of the vessel by Omani authorities. The intelligence exchanged among the three countries indicated that the trafficker vessel with drug cargo had left a Pakistani port carrying around 1 ton of different types of drugs in sealed packs. There seems to be a new drive in the region for boosting maritime cooperation against illicit drug trafficking (and illicit chemical trafficking) between the I. R. of Iran and regional Arab states.



Heroin seizures in the Republic of Kazakhstan, 2010 – 2015









Opiate seizures in the Kyrgyz Republic, 2011-2015












